





DESCRIPTION

The building that houses the Villa dei Cedri Museum is a villa dating back to the nineteenth century which has undergone a number of conversion projects in the course of its history.

The villa is in Ravecchia, a village lying on the slope of the Dragonato and Guasta mountain torrents, south of Bellinzona, a city of which it became part in 1907. In the late nineteenth century, Ravecchia was regarded as the "finest suburb of Bellinzona, with rich vegetation, villas and an uninterrupted view over the low valley of the Ticino stretching as far as Lake Maggiore" (Swiss Geographical Dictionary, 1906). This place of residence and holiday resort was also a setting for farming, gardening, cattle rearing and extensive orchards.

The project of endowing the City with an art museum seems to have taken shape in 1970. That was the year in which Emilio Sacchi, a physician, and Adolfo Rossi, a banker who originated from Bellinzona and worked in nearby Italy, donated to the community their own respective art collections, consisting for the most part of paintings dating from the seventeenth and twentieth centuries. The Rossi collection was shown to the public for the first time in 1973 in the Communal Palace; the Rossi and Sacchi collections that formed the first nucleus of the municipal art museum, were exhibited together in 1977, again on the premises of the municipal Palace. After the acquisition of the Villa dei Cedri and the foundation of the Civic Art Gallery, the decision was taken to give the young institution a distinct cultural vocation. The acquisition policy focussed on Swiss and Italian art from the second half of the nineteenth century to the present day, with particular emphasis on artists working in the region, and privileging a critical reappraisal of original figures and works created on paper.
